### A Message from the Pastor...

In the fall, we often begin new things in the life of the congregation. This fall is one of those times. Beginning this fall, we will begin a new offering for children in the congregation. Our Children's Chapel time will be held on the first Sunday of the month starting October 1 (you can see the specific dates listed in the graphic included in this newsletter). Children's Chapel will be a time for children to engage with God's word and prayer during the worship service. Children will begin the service sitting with their families for the opening hymn and prayer. Then after the prayer of the day they will gather at the front of the church for an introduction to the day's readings and theme. Then they will be led out of the sanctuary by the Children's Chapel leaders who will take them to another room to engage with the readings for the day on their level. They will hear at least one of the lessons read from a children's Bible and then talk about the story. They will gather to pray, concluding with learning the Lord's Prayer. During the sharing of the peace in the main worship service, the children will rejoin their families for communion and the close of service.

The goal in this effort is not so much a "mini-Sunday School" but a service of the word geared toward kids. While in worship, the adults are hearing the word of God read and then proclaimed in the sermon the children will be doing the same with the same passages at Children's Chapel. This format breaks up what can be a long service for little ones and keeps them engaged and moving to new things. It also gives adult family members a chance to focus more intently on the worship service without being preoccupied by managing their children.

This effort is being led and promoted by the Onward Niantic team. They are also planning an event for Sunday October 8<sup>th</sup> to share the results of their work, so far, and to continue to gather your thoughts and perspectives on the future of Christ Church. Mark your calendars for this important event while also marking your calendars with the dates for Children's Chapel. After marking your calendars see if you can get these dates on anyone else's calendar. Who are the children in your life that might not be attending church? Invite them and their families to worship on Children's Chapel Sundays. Explain what will happen. Show them the flyer. Encourage participation. These Sundays offer a ready-made "excuse" to invite families with children to experience the worship and fellowship here at Christ Lutheran Church.

Sunday September 17 provides another opportunity to invite your friends and family to get to know the community here. That is our Church Picnic Sunday. This year we are returning to Green Lane Park for our picnic. We will gather for worship to begin the events of the day and that will be followed with food, fun, and games. You can see more details listed in the newsletter or Sunday bulletin.

This fall, we have several opportunities to "stretch our evangelism muscles" and invite those in our lives to experience the life of Christ Church. Prayerfully consider who you might invite and see what God might do!

#### 3. Discretionary Fund (from Finance Report):

Discussion was tabled until July when the Pastor is available to provide additional input. A new line item can be added to the budget for 2024.

4. <u>Girl Scouts have asked to use the Social Hall again this year:</u> A Thank You was sent by the Girl Scouts along with a request to use our facility again. After some discussion, a motion was made by Bob Gabel and seconded by Marvin Steward to allow the Girl Scouts to use the Social Hall again during the upcoming school year. Motion passed.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

Financial results published in bulletin. Was addressed in last month's minutes. Possible updates to church sign: The Planning Committee has not met since our last Council meeting. There will be further discussion at the next meeting. Installation of Youth Council Member (Izzy Sandoval): Arrangements still need to be made between the Pastor and the Sandoval's. Pastor Matt is on vacation at this time. Bob Gabel, Pat Moser and June Herb met to discuss the church membership rolls. Those who have communed or donated since 2021 will be compared to active membership rolls.


