A Message from the Pastor...

On Sunday May 5, we will celebrate the blessing of the seeds. In the past, the occasion for blessing seeds and agricultural lands was known as Rogation Sunday. What is the history of this day? Marking days according to the seasons and the cycles of planting and harvest is common in many different cultures and religions. Several of the major feasts in the Jewish calendar are centered on the traditional harvest periods in the holy land. Christianity, however, does not recognize an explicit harvest or planting connection to the major feasts of the church year. Historically there have been days set apart within the church year, which look to the seasonal changes and the activities associated with the different seasons (planting and harvest). The rogation days within the Easter season are days where the church prays to God asking for blessing of human work and have traditionally been associated with springtime agricultural work.

The old Roman Catholic calendar (pre-Vatican II) contained both major and minor rogation days. As the observance of rogation days became officially recognized the celebrations associated with the days became formalized. The epistle text was from James (5:16-20) and the gospel from Luke (11:5-13). The gospel lesson concerns asking things of God, and is the origin of the term rogation, from the Latin "to ask" (*rogare*). A procession and the litany of the saints would precede the celebration of the mass on the rogation days. The procession begins at the high altar and may travel through the streets of the city or through the agricultural fields.

In 1969, the Roman Catholic Church reformed the church year calendar, and the church no longer keeps the rogation days on specific days. Rogation days can still be celebrated; the local bishops, however, now declare rogation days. This is especially helpful to the churches in the southern hemisphere as they can adjust a rogation day to their own local seasonal cycle. In the U.S., the memorial of St. Isidore the Farmer on May 15 has become the occasion for the blessing of farmers and farmlands.

In Lutheran churches, the fifth Sunday after Easter was known as *Rogate*. This also was derived from the gospel lesson appointed for the day, this time from John (16:23-30). In rural areas, it became customary to include a blessing of seed, soil, and water and possibly a procession out of the church to a local field. The Episcopal Church lists the minor rogation days before Ascension as commemorations in the church year calendar and provides three prayers for rogation days each with a different theme (fruitful seasons, commerce and industry, and stewardship of creation). In 1946, an ecumenical effort in the US south led to the designation of the fifth Sunday after Easter as "Soil and Soul Sunday".

The celebration of rogation services provides Christian congregations with an opportunity to deepen the role of faith in everyday life. In asking God's blessing on our daily work, we can see that a rogation service can reconnect the "everyday" with the "religious". These occasions remind us that God is present and active in all aspects of life, not just on Sunday mornings inside the church building.

Council Highlights from February 27, 2024 meeting:

1. Finance report minutes from the meeting on 2/20
 - a. There was a question about the accuracy of the "expenses and contributions for year to date" in the bulletin. Sue Hoffman made a motion to remove the statistical information and only include it in the monthly newsletter. Roxanne Fox seconded the motion. Bob Heydt will communicate with Melissa to implement this change.
 - b. Memorial Fund: Bob Heydt suggested exploring reclassification, possibly directing some funds to the building fund or a sound system. Steve Novotny raised concerns about potentially offending donors if funds were not used according to the memorial fund guidelines. Bob Heydt suggested that committees create a new list for consideration, re-publicize it, and seek input from donors.
 - c. Should members get credit for choice dollars - if you are a Thrivent member you can donate your choice dollars to a contribution; tax information about charitable contributions are between the member and their tax advisor
 - d. Sue Hoffman has only paid the first quarter of the insurance policy; shopping around for a new policy
2. Synod assembly: registration is open; election for new bishop and budget will be passed
3. Special congregational meeting: May 5th or 19th: discuss constitution and endowment plan changes, and youth council member
4. The heating and AC systems - discuss maintenance; Steve Novotny offered to investigate the efficiency of the system because of its age; a new one may be burn less fuel and be more cost-effective
5. Planning committee: Bob Heydt suggested that each committee to come up with a goal for 1 year; 3 year and 5 year outlook; might be helpful to look at other groups that are underserved
6. A member proposed installing a basketball hoop in the parking lot, raising concerns about potential liability for injuries, even though we are covered by insurance, filing claims could increase rates or lead to policy cancellation
7. Publicity - offer to post congregation updates on Instagram for a broader publicity strategy
8. Advertising for Easter in Southern Berks News and Boyertown Times; list service times; "activities for children"

OLD BUSINESS:

1. Cleaning of social hall: Melissa gives a reminder about social hall activity - we can clean it up right before hand

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Steve Novotny noted neglected sites post-funeral, outsourced company handles this; Butch addresses holes while mowing
2. Gerry apologized about the Christmas Eve ceremony with candles - maybe more training about light switches
3. Safety Concern: if downstairs doors are locked at the start of the service, a sign indicating front door availability after 9 must be displayed.
4. Visitors: one signed card (given to Melissa), one signed book: contact information will be given to Melissa
5. Council viewed "If I were a devil" from 1965 - a 3 minute YouTube video

Council Highlights from March 26, 2024 meeting:

1. Insurance coverage - council members reviewed a comparison between Church Mutual (current) and Brotherhood Mutual (proposed); When viewing the policies side by side, there are some differences; more information is needed before committing to anything at this time; Roxanne Fox wrote down questions for when the agent calls back; council will revisit this at the next meeting
2. Synod assembly is May 3-4: registration is open for another week
3. Bally Community Center Golf Outing (May 11th): if we do a community cookout we can sponsor/advertise at the event: a sign at the hole is approximately \$100
4. Special Congregational Meeting will be postponed until the fall (no objections); the Constitution is ready to be circulated; a new youth council member (if one can be found) can serve May 1st
5. Council members viewed a page from St. John's (Boyertown) newsletter about "keeping membership simple"; Pastor Matt has agreed to type up a similar posting for Melissa to add to the newsletter on a regular basis; once a member - you remain a member; just cannot vote if they do not fill out a communion card and contributed one time per year
6. Heating and AC system update: Steve Novotny stated that there was no new information on the ac unit but was able to get some information about the boiler. After finding the model number, taking photos and dimensions of the boiler, Steve stated that the company wants to come out and actually look at it before giving any recommendations or a quote to replace it; there might be other changes or connections that need to be done; they know that we are planning for the future; Steve will pass along information to council as he receives it,
7. Planning Committee: Community Cookout on June 15th (3-7 pm) is under consideration (subject to have enough people to staff it); a signup sheet is up; yard games; free food; divine entertainment

OLD BUSINESS:

1. The issue of the cleaning of social hall has been resolved - clean as needed
2. The topic of charitable contributions and tax information has been clarified; any tax concerns regarding donations should be discussed between the member and their tax advisor

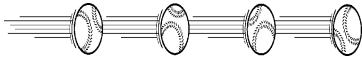

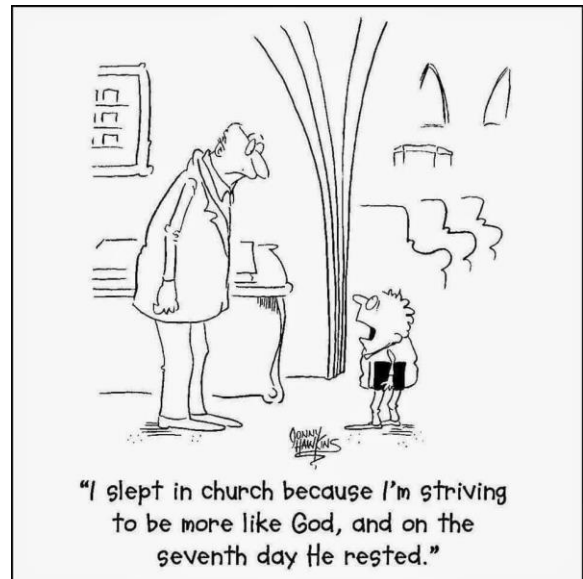

80+ Birthday Party Celebration

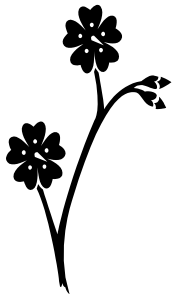
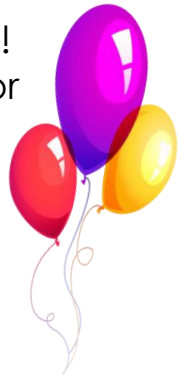


