A Message from the Pastor...

A blessed Advent season to you. Most of the time we associate Advent with the month of December. Some years the entire season occurs in the month of December but many years it begins in November. This year is one of those years. Sunday November 30 begins our Advent observance this year. Advent is not only a season to await the coming of Christ but also an opportunity to remember and celebrate the faithful witnesses who have shaped and inspired the Church. The Lutheran Church calendar is rich with commemorations during Advent, highlighting saints and significant figures whose lives exemplify hope, perseverance, and devotion. There are several commemorations that fall on the weekends of Advent this year and in our sermons, we will spend some time learning more about these Saints of Advent.

The first Sunday of Advent marks the commemoration of St. Andrew the apostle and the brother of Peter. Andrew's willingness to follow Christ and bring others to him makes him a fitting figure to start Advent which is a time of invitation and expectation.

The next weekend we remember two saints of the early church, St. Nicholas and St. Ambrose. Both were bishops in the 4th century who greatly influenced the direction of the Church. Nicholas was known for his charity and advocacy for the vulnerable, values that resonate during the Advent season. He was also an important voice at the council of Nicaea. Ambrose was a theologian, hymn writer, and influential church leader. His contributions to liturgy and doctrine reinforce the importance of worship and truth in the life of the Church.

The third weekend of Advent brings us to two other saints, Lucy (or Lucia) and John of the Cross. St. Lucy's story is one of steadfast faith even in the face of persecution. Celebrated for her unwavering commitment to Christ, Lucy's commemoration encourages believers to let their light shine in times of darkness. John of the Cross was a Spanish priest, spiritual writer, and poet. It is in his writings where we get the phrase "the dark night of the soul."

On the final Sunday in Advent, we will celebrate someone in our own Lutheran history who is often mentioned but rarely focused upon, Katharina von Bora Luther. She is of course the nun who married Martin Luther. She was a renewer of the Church as well and an important figure in Wittenburg during the Reformation.

Each commemoration during Advent connects the lives of these past saints to the themes of the season: hope, peace, joy, and love. Through their stories, we are invited to consider how their virtues and values can be embodied today. The saints of Advent remind us that the journey toward Christmas is not just about waiting but about living faithfully in expectation for the arrival of Emmanuel, God with us.

Highlights of the Council Meeting on August 26, 2025:

- 1. Congregational Vitality Survey will run Sept. 28–Oct. 12; Dave Fioriglio and Danny Knaub will be coordinating. The Pastor will provide church-specific links and Danny will be explaining it to the congregation. There will be a shortened notice to put in the bulletin and printed copies of the survey will be available as needed.
- 2. Community cookout advertising will run on Facebook and Instagram until the day of the cookout
- 3. Church was contacted as a polling location Pastor will tell them no because of the lack of space and the inability to accommodate the need.

STAFF REPORTS, COMMITTEE REPORTS & FINANCIAL REPORTS

- Property:
 - Roof repairs on the shed completed at a cost of \$2,187.56 (includes additional work to attach siding); Marvin Steward paid and will be reimbursed. Exterior painting quote received for \$4,850, but concern was raised that results may not last more than 2–3 years. Alternate quote for siding, overhead garage door, and walk-in door totaled \$6,800, which also included the roof repair already completed. This option offers longer durability. The Property Committee requested approval to proceed; funds to come from the Building Fund. Motion made by Gerry Flicker and seconded by Keith Folk, to approve the project not to exceed \$8,000. Motion passed.
 - o Road sign information: Gerry Flicker is awaiting a quote;
 - Additional two parking spaces to accommodate possible van accessible spot exempt by ADA because of it being a church; waiting on a price to see if we can paint over or grind out previous spots

A motion made by Danny Knaub and seconded by Roxanne Fox to accept the committee reports pending audit. Motion passed.

OLD BUSINESS:

- 1. SafePlace Training: Mutual Ministries will review options, seeking free resources so the additional funds from the Christian Ed category can be sent to Texas flood relief. Will revisit after reviewing policy to determine specific training needs
- 2. Grief Counseling: Pastor reported that Sylvia will lead sessions Sept. 25–Oct. 23, Thursdays from 4–5:30 p.m. in the parlor. Pat Moser will contact four local funeral homes regarding \$600 sponsorship. The program will be advertised on Facebook and shared with other congregations.

NEW BUSINESS:

1. Social Hall Use and Cleaning: Concerns were raised about inadequate cleanup by members after using the social hall. Proposal: require all users to submit a separate cleaning deposit check upfront. Deposit will be returned if cleanup meets standards; otherwise, it will be used to cover cleaning costs. Social hall contract to be updated to reflect this policy. Current member rate is \$135 rental plus \$75 cleaning deposit (same for voting and non-voting members). Cleanup checklist will be provided; failure to meet requirements will result in forfeiture of deposit. A motion made by Dave Fioriglio and seconded by Roberta Korsack. Motion passed.
